RULES, REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All rules, regulations and information pertaining to this show can be found in the Current AYE Young Paraders Manual. We encourage you to read through prior to the show. (If you would like a copy please contact the convenor) AAA Halter Showing Rules. The Showing Rules Manual of the Australian Alpaca Association (AAA) has been prepared by the AAA's Showing and Judging Committee and defines the rules and regulations applying to the activity of showing alpacas. Where relevant, and not specifically in conflict with the contents of this handbook, those rules and regulations apply equally to the conduct of a YPC, and it is therefore recommended that all those engaged within the activity of a YPC be familiar with its contents. In general terms, however, the YPC falls under the governance of the AAA, and reports to the Board through the AYE Committee made up of state representatives.

Companion animals and dogs: Special permission to bring a companion alpaca must be obtained from the Convenor prior to submission of the entry form, otherwise no companion alpacas will be permitted.

No dogs are permitted into the precinct of where Show animals are being penned or shown in the ring. Guide Dogs and registered Assistance Dogs are exempt.

4. Entry fees are as shown. Note: Members are entitled to a reduction on entry fees as shown.

REGULATIONS

To be read in conjunction with General Regulations

1. The breeding year for Beef Cattle dates as of the Sunday of the Show & for Dual Purpose & Dairy Cattle from 1st July in each year.

All pure bred stock exhibited may be subject to inspection by an inspector appointed by the Society, who will examine the tattoo brands on all stock exhibited, and if the animal/s are found to be incorrectly branded, they will be disqualified.

2. Cow or heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging or vice versa.
3. Cows or Heifers entered in the "in milk" classes may be required to be stripped prior to entering the judging ring.
4. Judges have the right to order any cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.
5. All bulls born prior to January 1st 2023, MUST be fitted with a nose ring and secured by this at all times when being led. The Council reserves the right to order the immediate removal from the ground of any animal deemed to be dangerous.
6. Judging will commence at 9.00 am sharp and all stock must parade before the judges when called upon by the Stewards to do so. The Judge's decision shall be final and binding.

7. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age and any breeding animal not being completely entire shall be final.
8. All entries must be submitted through Show Day online
9. All stock must be bona fide property of the exhibitor. The Council may call upon any exhibitor to produce evidence to verify the fact.
10. All prize-winning animals are asked to take part in the Grand Parade. A Parade Card will be issued to exhibitors when they enter the arena for the Grand Parade. This should be presented with the prize voucher for the collection of Prize money.
11. No stock can be removed from the ground before the Grand Parade.
12. Champion and Reserve Champion Sashes will be presented for Championships in each breed with over 15 exhibits. Where Reserve Champions are awarded, Exhibits placed 2nd in class to Champion are to be judged for Reserve Champion.
13. All Dairy Stud stock exhibited must be registered with their respective Breed Societies.
14. Competition in Stud Beef classes is restricted to pure bred animals which are registered with their respective Breed Societies
15. The Judge may award a second or third prize instead of a first, or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit, or where exhibits are not considered worthy. No animal will be allowed to win more than one first prize except specials.
16. All cows in milk must be milked out immediately after final judging of their class to the satisfaction of the Steward.
17. Exhibitors parading cattle are requested to wear dustcoats, or breed uniform.
18. Judges shall be required to refrain from conferring on exhibits before or during judging.
19. Cattle under quarantine or Cattle from a property under quarantine are not eligible to compete.
20. The Publishers of this Schedule & the Whittlesea Agricultural Society have made every endeavour to obtain correctness of details in all entries. No responsibility shall be taken for any errors which may occur.
21. Herd Health Status and Waiver Forms or Public Liability Insurance (minimum \$10million) Certificate of Currency to be completed and returned with Entries - including Pesti Virus for Stud Cattle.
22. Any animal exhibiting signs of a contagious disease (eg, ringworm) will not be permitted on the grounds.

1. Sheep admitted to the Showgrounds must be identified in accordance with Agriculture Victoria (EDJTR)

Electronic Livestock Identification System (NLIS) (Sheep & Goats) Standards, ALL SHEEP will be scanned and reported to the NLIS Database.

2. A National Sheep Health Statement must be completed by all exhibitors and returned with entry form.

3. Sheep may be shown either in wool or shorn, shorn sheep to be shorn after 1st August 2022

4. All sheep and lambs must be registered with the respective breed organisation and tagged with the breeders property of origin NLIS tag. Sheep not tagged will be disqualified and must be removed from the showgrounds.

5. **REGISTRATION DETAILS AND FLOCK NUMBER MUST BE WRITTEN ON ENTRY FORM**, or entry will be ineligible.

6. All Rams to be Brucellosis tested, or from brucellosis accredited free flocks. **All exhibitors must include a photocopy of their Ovine Brucellosis Accreditation Certificate with the Entry form otherwise entry will not be accepted.**
