



HISTORY

The mother of Victorian Agricultural Societies, the Port Phillip Farmers' Society was founded in 1848, consisting of the parent body (later the National Agricultural Society) and finally the Royal Agricultural Society and three branches – Mornington, Bacchus Marsh and Gisborne. In 1856, the Mornington Farmers' Society was formed and the Society's first Show was held at Cranbourne in 1857. Two years later Mornington, Bacchus Marsh and Gisborne held Shows and it was during 1859 that the Whittlesea Agricultural Society had its beginnings on a site near the Whittlesea Railway Station. Here the Whittlesea Fair was held on Tuesday, 3rd May. There were 40 members, who subscribed approximately 1 pound each. Through lack of interest and support from the branches, the Port Phillip Farmers' Society disbanded, the last Show being in 1867, and all the Show's assets were handed over to trustees for the new National Agricultural Society in 1870. The Mornington Farmers' Society continued to progress. Eventually in 1918, the Society became known as the Berwick and District Agricultural and Horticultural Society. From this snippet of history it can be seen that the Whittlesea Agricultural Society in its own right has the proud distinction of being one of the oldest functioning Agricultural Societies in Victoria.

HORSE REGULATIONS

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.
- Where height is stipulated, Equestrian Australia or Show Horse Council current height Certificates will
 be accepted but the committee and judges reserve the right to re-measure any horse or pony at any
 time. When measuring a horse, galloway or pony, an allowance of (3/8) of an inch for shoes may be
 made at the discretion of the measurer.
- 3. Horses are not permitted to enter the judging ring if fitted with bearing reins.
- 4. Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council and every exhibitor shall be bound to observe these rules.
- The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.
- 6. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.
- 7. All led stallions must have a bit in mouth (3 years and over).
- 8. Any male animal competing in specific stallion/colt classes in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete. Any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.
- 9. Horse prize winners are kindly asked to take part in the Grand Parade. A Parade card will be issued to exhibitors when they enter the arena for the Grand Parade. This should be presented with prize voucher for collection of prize money. (Friday classes excluded). Horse prize money will be available ONLY from the Horse Pavilion after the Grand Parade and until 5pm or at the discretion of the Horse Superintendent only.
- 10. Children under the age of 6 must be led or accompanied by an adult if competing in the Grand Parade.
- 11. All competitors under the age of 18 years must supply proof of age with entry. Proof of age will be accepted in the form of birth certificate, extract of birth entry, statutory declaration by either parent, baptismal certificate or Principal's certificate.
- 12. Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its officials or members in any respect whatsoever.
- 13. All foals must be haltered in the ring.
- 14. A novice is a horse not having won a first prize at an Agricultural Show.
- 15. Certificate showing proof of Registration with a particular Breed Society to be produced if requested on the day.
- 16. Random swabbing of horses may take place under Equestrian Australia Anti Doping Regulations as per Equestrian Australia National Medication Control rules and Show Horse Council Rules.
- 17. VAS Ltd rules apply. http://www.vicagshows.com.au
- 18. VAS Ltd approved helmets must be worn by all competitors. EA approved helmets to be worn by all Jumpers and Interschool Competitors.
- 19. When a class is age restricted, eg Riders, Smartest on Parade and Child's Mounts, top boots or gaiters cannot be worn by competitors under the age of 18 years.
- 20. Waiver form must be signed by all competitors. If under 18 a parent or guardian must sign on their behalf. Any riders not signing waiver form will forfeit any qualification and prize money.
- 21. Any PRIZE MONEY or trophies will be forfeited if not collected on show weekend.
- 22. Yards are available on a first-in basis. Cost is \$20 per day or \$50 for weekend (3 days). Yards and Memberships are non- refundable.

CATTLE REGULATIONS

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The breeding year for Beef Cattle dates as of the Sunday of the Show & for Dual Purpose & Dairy Cattle from 1st July in each year.
 - All pure bred stock exhibited may be subject to inspection by an inspector appointed by the Society, who will examine the tattoo brands on all stock exhibited, and if the animal/s are found to be incorrectly branded, they will be disqualified.
- Cow or heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging or vice versa.
- 3. Cows or Heifers entered in the "in milk" classes may be required to be stripped prior to entering the judging ring.
- 4. Judges have the right to order any cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.
- 5. All bulls born prior to November 1st 2022, MUST be fitted with a nose ring and secured by this at all times when being led. The Society reserves the right to order the immediate removal from the ground of any animal deemed to be dangerous.
- 6. Judging will commence at 9.00 am sharp and all stock must parade before the judges when called upon by the Stewards to do so. The Judge's decision shall be final and binding.
- 7. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age and any breeding animal not being completely entire shall be final.
- 8. All entries must be submitted through Show Day online or the Administration Office.
- 9. All stock must be bona fide property of the exhibitor. The Society may call upon any exhibitor to produce evidence to verify the fact.
- 10. All prize-winning animals are asked to take part in the Grand Parade. A Parade Card will be issued to exhibitors when they enter the arena for the Grand Parade. This should be presented with the prize voucher for the collection of Prize money.
- 11. No stock can be removed from the ground before the Grand Parade.
- 12. Champion and Reserve Champion Sashes will be presented for Championships in each breed with over 15 exhibits. Where Reserve Champions are awarded, Exhibits placed 2nd in class to Champion are to be judged for Reserve Champion.
- 13. All Dairy Stud stock exhibited must be registered with their respective Breed Societies.
- 14. Competition in Stud Beef classes is restricted to pure bred animals which are registered with their respective Breed Societies
- 15. The Judge may award a second or third prize instead of a first, or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit, or where exhibits are not considered worthy. No animal will be allowed to win more than one first prize except specials.
- All cows in milk must be milked out immediately after final judging of their class to the satisfaction of the Steward.
- 17. Exhibitors parading cattle are requested to wear dustcoats, or breed uniform.
- 18. Judges shall be required to refrain from conferring on exhibits before or during judging.
- 19. Cattle under quarantine or Cattle from a property under quarantine are not eligible to compete.
- 20. The Publishers of this Schedule & the Whittlesea Agricultural Society have made every endeavor to obtain correctness of details in all entries. No responsibility shall be taken for any errors which may occur.
- 21. Herd Health Status and Waiver Forms or Public Liability Insurance (minimum \$10million) Certificate of Currency to be completed and returned with Entries including Pesti Virus for Stud Cattle.
- 22. Any animal exhibiting signs of a contagious disease (eg, ringworm) will not be permitted on the grounds.





RULES, REGULATIONS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. All rules, regulations and information pertaining to this show can be found in the Current AYE Young Paraders Manual. We encourage you to read through prior to the show. (If you would like a copy please contact the convenor) AAA Halter Showing Rules. The Showing Rules Manual of the Australian Alpaca Association (AAA) has been prepared by the AAA's Showing and Judging Committee and defines the rules and regulations applying to the activity of showing alpacas. Where relevant, and not specifically in conflict with the contents of this handbook, those rules and regulations apply equally to the conduct of a YPC, and it is therefore recommended that all those engaged within the activity of a YPC be familiar with its contents. In general terms, however, the YPC falls under the governance of the AAA, and reports to the Board through the AYE Committee made up of state representatives.
- Companion animals and dogs: Special permission to bring a companion alpaca must be obtained from the
 Convenor prior to submission of the entry form, otherwise no companion alpacas will be permitted. No dogs
 are permitted into the precinct of where Show animals are being penned or shown in the ring. Guide Dogs and
 registered Assistance Dogs are exempt.

STOCKMANSHIP

This section offers the opportunity to demonstrate the excellence in the handling of alpacas in their normal daily management. This highlights through consistent training the bond that can be formed between the alpaca and its handler. Stockmanship is designed to simulate challenges that an alpaca and handler may face in day to day management by progressing through a series of stations/challenges. Training, teamwork and trust between the alpaca and handler are the key focus of this competition.

SHOWMANSHIP

This section demonstrates excellence in preparation, presentation and handling of alpacas in the show ring. It enables young people the opportunity to demonstrate a sound understanding and general knowledge of alpacas, their conformation and husbandry needs. Showmanship (Open section) simulates the halter classes at a show. This section evaluates competitors on their knowledge of show ring presentation and etiquette, Alpaca handling and ability to display the alpaca at its best to the judge for assessment. Showmanship (Preliminary section) will be judged in a pen situation where competitors will complete a hands on assessment and be required to show an understanding of alpaca fleece conformation and husbandry.

OPEN DIVISION

This offers an increased level of competition to assist and encourage young people to elevate their learning and involvement within the alpaca industry. This level involves Show Presentation and Stockmanship. Within the Open Division, there exists the opportunity for competitors to compete for the Trainers Award at each competition and the Master Trainers State Awards. These awards are open only to those individuals who are competing (as a "pair") with an Alpaca which they have specifically trained and prepared for the event. Scores from Show Preparation and Stockmanship sections will be added together to give a total score. Competitors must nominate for the trainer's award on the entry form. One trainer's award will be awarded per show taken from all age groups in the Open Division. The Trainers award will only be awarded if their score is within 90% of the top overall score (Showmanship and Stockmanship) on the day of competition.

PRELIMINARY DIVISION

This is the commencement of the Championship level in the Young Paraders Program. It introduces Showmanship to competitors, increases their education and knowledge, incorporates hands-on assessments and is aimed at young people seeking to attain a higher level of their understanding and skills within our industry on farm and in the show ring. At this level, Stockmanship offers a higher degree of difficulty including up to 8 stations/challenges.

250g sultanas 250g chopped raisins

250g currants

125g chopped mixed peel 90g chopped red glace cherries 90g chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250g plain flour 60g self-raising flour ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg

½ teaspoon ground ginger ½ teaspoon ground cloves 250g butter

250g soft brown sugar ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind. ½ teaspoon vanilla essence ½ teaspoon almond essence

4 large eggs

FRUIT CAKE METHOD

- 1. Cut the fruit and almonds into 3 4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- 3. Place the mixture in a square tin no larger than **20cm square**, **straight sided**, **square cornered tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

375 g plain flour½ tsp allspice3 medium carrots grated (350 grams)2 tsp baking powder2 tsp salt220g tin crushed pineapple drained1 ½ tsp bicarb soda345 g castor sugar180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed

2 tsp ground cinnamon 375 ml vegetable oil

½ tsp ground nutmeg 4 eggs

CARROT CAKE METHOD

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90 100 minutes.
- 4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH GROUP REGULATIONS

- Society Member's Ticket \$70 admits member, guest and up to 4 children 14 years & under on both days of Annual Show and vehicle to Member's Car Park.
- 2. Public admission:

- 3. Entries: Entry fees for livestock, arena events, with the exception of Feature Events, are subject to a reduction of 1/3 of the price to holders of Member's Tickets.
- 4. At 3.00 pm all prizewinners in Horses and Stud Cattle sections are required to parade.
- 5. In all sections where there are two or more prizes, there must be three competitors or only one prize will be awarded, unless the judges consider the exhibit worthy of a prize.
- The judges may award a second instead of a first where the animals or articles are not considered of sufficient merit.
- 7. All exhibits to stay in the Showgrounds until 5 pm, excepting livestock.
- 8. Breeding year for horses dates from August 1, for dairy cattle from July 1, and for beef cattle as at the final day of the Show.
- 9. Any animal, in the opinion of the judge, to be over the age specified, will be referred to the Chief Stewards.
- 10. Stallions are not eligible to compete in ridden classes unless specified.
- 11. Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured and ticket endorsed by Official Measurer who will be in attendance from 7.30 am to 8.30am or have a current VAS Ltd/SHC or EA height certificate.
- 12. Any protests to be lodged with the Secretary (together with \$150 deposit, which will be forfeited if complaint is frivolous), within 60 minutes after award, or for Sections judged prior to the Show, within 60 minutes of Show opening time. The Chief Stewards will consider the protest and their decision will be final.
- 13. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list of awards does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Chief Stewards, with or without the advice of the judge, shall decide.
- 14. No exhibitor or spectator will be admitted to any judging area during the judging, unless requested to do so by the Steward in charge of the Section.
- 15. Any person commenting audibly in a disparaging manner on the judges' decisions, or who is guilty of unseemly conduct or insulting behaviour will, after being cautioned by a member of the Chief Stewards or Secretary, be expelled from the Showground, and the said person may forfeit any prize money or trophies gained. All Societies affiliated with the Central & Upper Goulburn Group shall be advised of this and under the Rules shall have power to take action. The judges' decision will be final.
- 16. All exhibitors, competitors or volunteers are expected to display appropriate behaviour and respect in dealing with the WAS Inc. representatives during the annual Show and related events. Inappropriate behaviour will be referred to the President and/or Chief Stewards for action.

- 17. Any person refusing to attach the prize card to any exhibit to which the prize is awarded and to keep the same on during the hours of the exhibition, will on proof thereof to the Chief Stewards, be disqualified from receiving all prizes awarded to the said person during the Show. Prize money to be paid on the Weekend of the Show. Any prizes not claimed within 30 days from date of Show become the property of the Society.
- 18. No claims for refunds of entry money will be paid, with the exception of Livestock on presentation of a vet's certificate.
- 19. The Council will not be responsible for trophies donated as a prize if not collected within thirty days of the Show.
- 20. All trophies not won outright to be returned to Secretary one week before Show Day.
- 21. The Society reserves the right to allot a trophy in place of prize money or vice versa.
- 22. The books of the Society close on the last day of December each year. All accounts must be in the hands of the Treasurer prior to this date.
- 23. Online entries are available at www.whittleseashow.org.au and entries on paper form must be received by the Secretary by the closing date. Closing dates for entries vary according to Sectional requirements, refer to information notes throughout the Schedule and on page 5. No late entries will be taken unless specified.
- 24. Most Pavilions will be closed at 5 pm on the Saturday and at 5pm on the Sunday of the Show. Exhibitors will be admitted without an entry ticket, only to take charge of their exhibits after 5.30pm.
- 25. All exhibits must, on the days of the Show, be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. The Society Council may call upon any exhibitor to make a statutory declaration to verify the fact.
- 26. (a) The Society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through an exhibit, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor or competitor shall not hold the Society responsible, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.
- (b) The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition, or any loss or damage thereto.
- (c) The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss by fire, storm, damage by water, flood or lightning. Exhibits and displays of all kinds accepted only on this condition.
- 27. All machinery in motion shall either be securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.
- 28. The right to hold Side Shows, Amusements or Exhibition Stands in the Showgrounds must be arranged and paid for before the owners can gain admission to the grounds; and the owners shall, during the days of the Show, be subject to the orders of the Grounds Manager. The Society reserves the right to stop any Side Show or other performance without giving any reason for such action, and all fees be forfeited to the Society. The authority of the Grounds Manager shall be binding on the Society in this matter.
- Gambling is strictly prohibited on the Showgrounds. Any person or persons found practising any illegal game will be referred to the Police.
- 30. GST will be added to the prize money for Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes and have provided an ABN
- 31. Any Prize money of \$100 or more may be directly paid into a bank account or paid by Society Cheque.
- 32. The Society reserves the right to use images taken at the Show in their media and promotional material. If you do not wish your image to be taken, please notify photographer.
- 33. All exhibitors (including trade, livestock & attractions) must supply a current copy of their Insurance Certificate of Currency when entering or confirming attendance. If not supplied, any claim on the Society's Insurance incurs a \$1,500.00 excess.
