STORY - CREATIVE LANGUAGE

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES PREP - 6

- Typed story preferred
- Up to 1000 words
- Front page to include Title, Student Name, Grade, School Name
- Please do not mount

POETRY - CREATIVE LANGUAGE

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES 3 - 6

- 1 poem only (no anthologies)
- Please do not mount
- 1 piece of A4 size or smaller
- Laminated preferred
- Typed poetry preferred

2 DIMENSIONAL ART

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES PREP - 6

- Painting, drawing, pastels etc (nothing is to be affixed to this artwork)
- Completed artwork excluding border to be no larger than A3, plus max 3cm border
- No hard frames allowed

THREADS & TEXTILES

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES PREP - 6

- Any form of artwork which contains the following: Sewing, knitting, weaving,
 embroidery, batik, felting etc
- Cannot be apparel

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES PREP - 6

- Paper Mache, Cardboard, Dioramas, Metal/Wood, Plastic/Recyclables
- Please note size restrictions
- All Primary School 3D art must not have a base area larger than 25cm x 25cm
- Height restriction of 60cm

COLLAGE

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES PREP - 6

- An artistic composition made by attaching pieces of paper, cloth, string etc, to a flat surface
- Completed artwork excluding border to be no larger than A3,
 plus max 3cm border
- · No hard frames allowed
- These exhibits are to be displayed on a wall therefore no 3D shapes to be included

GROUP PROJECT

YEAR LEVEL CLASSES: GRADES PREP - 6

- Group Projects are to be no larger than 1m x 1m and no longer than
 10 pages
- The theme may be based on a topic of your choice
- To be judged on content and relevance to the theme with attention
 to grammar
- Presentation is also important, but not the sole criteria


If there is only 1 exhibit in a class, placings are at the judge's discretion 1st place does not have to be awarded.

GENERAL REGULATIONS



Please read these instructions carefully as non-compliance will disqualify entry.

- 1. Please do not send exhibits via Australia Post or Courier.
- 2. ONE EXHIBIT PER STUDENT PER SECTION.
- 3. Exhibits to be completed by ONE student only except for Group Projects.
- 4. All exhibits MUST be original and be certified as having been completed at School. All exhibits are to be clearly labeled with an official exhibit card. This card must be attached to the front top right-hand side of 2D exhibits and within the boundary of the exhibit. Cards will be forwarded directly from ShowDay Online with your receipt / invoice upon acceptance of your entries.
- 5. Full payment to be made by credit card via the online entry system when entries are completed or via direct credit.
- 6. All PRIZE MONEY will be forwarded to the School after the Show. Please provide your school account details to accounts@whittleseashow.org.au prior to the Show.
- 7. All exhibits are to be appropriately packaged for ease of transportation. All submissions **MUST** be clearly labeled with: School, Name and Year level where appropriate.
- 8. 2D and written works e.g paintings, stories, poetry, should be submitted in an art folio or similar with the school name clearly visible. Entries will be returned to the school in the same folios.
- 9. 3D items should be in a suitable container that is clearly labeled with school name. It is the responsibility of the school to ensure fragile items are packed correctly (e.g ceramic, collage, modelling). Stewards will ensure all packing materials are used for the return to the school. All entries will be returned to the school in the same containers.
- 10. All exhibits will remain on display until 16:00 on the final day (Sunday). Stewards will commence the removal of entries from the display pavilion at this time. Teachers are encouraged to assist with the removal of exhibits if available to do so (it would really help us out).
- 11. Remaining exhibits can be collected from Monday 3rd of November from the Chandler Pavilion between the hours of 9am 2pm. Stewards will be removing and sorting the entries throughout the morning. Exhibits not collected on the Monday after the show will be available for collection from the Administration Building, Gate 1 McPhees Rd. Please contact the office for opening hours on 03 9716 2835.
- 12. The Society shall not under any circumstances be held responsible for any loss by fire, storm, damage by water, flood, or lightning. Exhibits and displays of all kinds accepted only on this condition.
- 13. The Society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused involving an exhibit, and it is a condition of entry that each exhibitor or competitor shall not hold the Society responsible and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.
- 14. Every endeavor will be made to display all exhibits.
- 15. The Judges' decision is final and binding there are no equal placings.
- 16. Entrants should ensure that all fabric articles are suitably covered in plastic to protect against dust.
